## ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

Excavations at Ayia Irini on the Cycladic island of Kea began in 1960 under the direction of John L. Caskey of the University of Cincinnati, under the auspices of the American School of Classical Studies at Athens (ASCSA). Aliki Halepa Bikaki oversaw excavation in a large part of the southeastern sector of the site, initially all designated as Area B. There, she discovered an LBA house (House B) and the Temple. Although the Temple was separated out from Area B in its records and publication schedule, Aliki was entrusted with the publication of the rest of Area B, namely the LBA House B and Alley AB, which separated House B from House A, as well as the EBA and MBA deposits below them. Aliki worked toward the publication of Area B until 2008, when she passed the assignment to me. I am grateful to Aliki for entrusting me with this project, and I am thankful to Jack Davis both for recommending me to Aliki and for his unflagging support of my work.

Aliki was an excellent archaeologist, and any success in this study is owed in large part to her diligence in excavating, observing, recording, and interpreting the story of Area B as it was uncovered. Over the course of decades spent analyzing the Area B remains, Aliki built up a collection of notes and drawings that she provided to me. I obtained additional excavation records from the Kea Excavation archives at the ASCSA and the University of Cincinnati. Carol Hershenson, Natalia Vogeikoff-Brogan, and Jeffrey Kramer provided access to and assistance with the archives. John Wallrodt helped me to create a database and manage my digital data.

Aliki's notes included stratigraphic sections, architectural plans and sketches, a working catalogue of ceramics and small finds, and prose summaries about some aspects of the area that seem to have been intended for her eventual publication. She had compiled summary descriptions of all the excavation units for the major deposits, including lists of elevations and finds and basic dating. A group of notes and sketches described the excavation and stratigraphy of the 1975 and 1976 test pits in detail. She had also located some ceramic comparanda, especially for Period III and Period VII deposits. Stratigraphic sections drawn by Aliki have been digitized. She also sketched the architecture and emerging stratigraphy in the excavation notebooks; some of those sketches are included here when they provide additional evidence for the interpretation of the stratigraphy or architecture (Pls. 19, 20).

The plans that Aliki drew were based on the architects' field sheets. Site architects were Lloyd Cotsen, Charles K. Williams, Roger Holzen, and W. Willson Cummer; the architectural drawings adapted for this volume were not signed or initialed unless otherwise noted. Aliki used modified versions of the field sheets to show walls, features, and the placement of test pits, as well as to compile elevations. Information from her plans has been incorporated into phase plans (Figs. 19–25), drawn from the architects' field sheets, with the exception of the Period IV plan (Fig. 20), which existed (unsigned) in the Kea archives at the ASCSA.

Aliki created a preliminary catalogue of ceramics and small finds for all of the combined lots in Area B and for the test pit in Alley AB. All ceramics that she numbered for her catalogue have been included here. Descriptions are mine, unless otherwise noted. Many additional sherds have also been included in my catalogue.
