

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

I first became interested in the Demotic loan-account papyri of Panas, son of Espmetis, when I worked at the Papyrological Institute of Leiden University. There I encountered a description of the archive of Panas, son of Espmetis, and separately a description of an unpublished Demotic loan-account papyrus naming Panas, son of Espmetis, BM EA 10556, which had not been attributed to his archive. Further research revealed a second unpublished Demotic loan-account papyrus of Panas, son of Espmetis, BM EA 10557.

I am deeply grateful to Prof. Ursula Kaplony-Heckel for her encouragement and support of my research, and for her generosity in sharing her detailed knowledge of collections of Demotic papyri and ostraca, from which I have benefited on multiple occasions. In this case during a visit to Marburg on Saturday–Sunday, 21–22 May 2011, I mentioned to her my interest in working on papyri BM EA 10556 and 10557. She smiled mischievously, and pulled out of a file cabinet her fifty-year-old hand-copies of a third unpublished demotic loan-account papyrus, BM EA 10670. A quick perusal indicated that it too belonged to Panas, son of Espmetis, and further study revealed that it contained working drafts of the loan-accounts recorded in BM EA 10556 and 10557.

I would like to thank all the staff of the British Museum Department of Egypt and Sudan who assisted me during my visits to study the loan-account papyri of Panas, son of Espmetis; and particularly Prof. Richard Parkinson and Dr. Ilona Regulski. I examined and photographed papyrus BM EA 10556 at the British Museum on Wednesday–Thursday, 14–15 January 2009, and papyrus BM EA 10557 on Thursday–Friday, 24–25 June 2010. I then requested and received permission to publish the papyri from Richard Parkinson on behalf of the British Museum on 12 July 2010. After Ursula Kaplony-Heckel called my attention to papyrus BM EA 10670, I examined and photographed it at the British Museum on Monday, 5 September 2011, and I then requested and received permission to publish the papyrus from Richard Parkinson on behalf of the British Museum on 9 September 2011. Ilona Regulski kindly provided me with scans of all the papyri on 29 March 2019, in advance of another visit to the British Museum on Tuesday–Thursday, 9–11 April 2019 to reexamine the loan-account papyri to check my readings against the originals.
